**Pinwheels For Prevention:**



“April showers bring May flowers;” so, the saying goes...at the rate we are going, May should be a veritable bower! Rainy weather did not deter the intrepid ladies of the CE&O Committee from planting our annual “Pinwheels For Prevention” Garden in downtown Haymarket to call attention to the issue of child abuse. The cheerful display of pinwheels spinning in the wind is a reminder to those driving on the main street of the town that every child deserves a safe environment and a commitment from all of us to protect them. The Haymarket Town Council joined with us in emphasizing this need to care for our children and issued a proclamation at their monthly meeting declaring April to be “Child Abuse Awareness Month.” Committee members in attendance were presented with a copy of the official proclamation; we presented the council members with lapel pins inscribed with “A Happy Childhood

Lasts a Lifetime,” which were gratefully received. All DWC members were given “Stand Up For Children” bracelets with a card detailing the physical and behavioral signs of abuse at our March monthly meeting.

We have some really good news to share about our “Dollars For Doggies” outreach! After learning at the March DWC meeting that we were seriously behind in collecting donations for our puppy sponsorship for “Canine Companions For Independence,” you, our good-hearted members, donated \$93! That left us with only \$61 more dollars to collect; then our resourceful community liaison Deb Jewell reached out to local business “A Pup’s Valley” in Haymarket who generously donated \$200! We are so grateful for this added support... we can now sponsor the training of TWO puppies as companion dogs! Thank you so much for making this happen. We will also be seeking community support at our lovely Spring Garden Tea.

Also at the March meeting, Susie Collat distributed sets of ten spring themed cards for members to write encouraging messages to the residents at the Gainesville Health & Rehabilitation Center; Susie will collect these and deliver them to the center later this month. Sharayu Tulpule shared the good news that we will be playing bunco with residents again starting in the fall; more information will come after we meet with the new activity’s director in May.

We continue to work on crocheting and purchasing octopi for premature babies and children at the cardiac unit at Inova Hospital and we plan to work on our “Caring on the Go” outreach to homebound seniors and veterans later this month. We wanted to share our experience from the March 12th Boxes of Basics tour. Six members attended and were very impressed with the mission and organized process at Boxes of Basics. We are certain that these children will have increased confidence and really thrive knowing that these boxes of seasonal wardrobes were lovingly wrapped.



It is very easy to sign up individually to volunteer at [www.boxesofbasics.org](http://www.boxesofbasics.org) to either pack or deliver the boxes. The calendar fills in quickly and they are closed during the summer. We were hoping to go as a group April 19th, but the spots filled with only four of us on the list. Grab a friend or two, coordinate your schedules and have a fulfilling hour of giving back to the local community. Come fall, we are planning a ‘**Pajama-rama**’ collection of new pj’s for these kids...more to come!

Another vital volunteer opportunity is to pack or deliver food at Crossroads Connection. Please visit [crossroads-connection.org](http://crossroads-connection.org) to sign up with your DWC friends to keep our local children fed over the weekends. The food donation list is on their web site, and we are happy to pick up any food and deliver it for you or you may bring it to a club meeting. They are now serving almost four hundred vetted children with food insecurity.

At the March DWC club meeting, Rosemary Boettke kicked off her **President’s Project to support Alzheimer’s** research and those in our local community living with the disease and their caregivers. Rosemary has asked us to get the word out and plans to volunteer at the ‘Memory Cafe’ at local libraries being sponsored by Comfort Keepers. We will again support the Alzheimer’s walk fundraiser in October.

Dr. Stan Jones, CEO of **ACTS**, is excited to speak to our whole club this coming year. **ACTION** in Community Through Service became our Woman’s Health Project for Prince William County. Their services include those for domestic violence, rapid re-housing, emergency shelter, utility assistance and Senior Link. In addition to our donation, would it not be fulfilling to be a volunteer for their Senior Link?!!! This free call reassurance program provides scheduled phone calls to senior citizens who might be feeling isolated.

We have sent a ‘**File of Life**’ sample and hope to distribute these to our members. These are filled with medical information that is critical to First Responders in improving emergency medical care. Look for more on this in September.

We will not be having a formal meeting in April or May as we really hope all of you will take that time to be our ‘**Volunteers in Action.**’ Please let Barb Garland know if you can volunteer at hole eighteen to support the **Swing for Life** golf tournament on May 23rd. Barb Garland has requested volunteers for two shifts of three people each shift. The times are 8:45-11 and 11-1. We will be donating \$250 to support Ovarian Cancer Research.

The Care and Concern sub-committee is ongoing, and members are asked to reach out to Barbara Murray and/or Sue Mork themselves when needing extra support. Examples of how we have helped our DWC sisters in the past have included cards, meal trains, and baskets of cheer after illness, surgery or deaths in the immediate family.
