GFWC Virginia's National Day of Service:





We started in September by participating in GFWC Virginia's National Day of Service to create awareness about food insecurity; thirteen of our members volunteered at the Haymarket. Regional Food Pantry helping to distribute food to people facing food insecurity.

In addition, six members staffed a booth at the Haymarket Farmer's Market and handed out information.about the problem of food insufficiency and spoke to the patrons about the needs of the pantry and how to donate. Many people stopped by to chat with us and to pick up brochures

and lists of food items, one man even pledged to Susie that he wanted to make a generous monetary donation! We will be presenting that check and the check from our committee to the Food. pantry in the upcoming weeks.

One of the things that we learned during our service at the Food Panty was that they are in need of breakfast items; the shelves for that item were completely bare! So, to help. meet that need, we are thinking of having a collection of breakfast cereals at our meetings. More info to follow soon.

Our next endeavor will be to create our "Purple Posies" to call attention to the problem of domestic abuse and to provide info to those needing help. We will be meeting on October 10th. at the Bull Run Regional Library's Makerspace from 1-4 PM. The Makerspace room is the perfect place to paint our flowerpots, decorate them, add information about where to find help. and then fill them with purple mums; we then take them to places where the information might. be seen and collected by women needing help to report abuse and to escape dangerous. situations.
