Civic Engagement and Outreach Committee Co-Chairs: Mary Ellen Murphy and Susie Collat

The Civic Engagement & Outreach Committee's kick-off project for each club year is our "Purple Posies" project, which highlights the need to make information available for getting help to victims of domestic abuse. On September 18th, members of the Committee met at the Bull Run Regional library's Maker Space to paint clay pots purple (the signature color for domestic abuse awareness), to decorate them and to plant them with purple mums. The display included information on recognizing what behaviors or actions can be considered abusive as well as phone numbers for helplines to report abuse or to receive assistance. The completed "Purple Posies" were then distributed by Committee members to areas that might be easily available to those needing help: local salons, doctor's offices, the ER, libraries, supermarkets and churches. We also had two guests who joined us for the activity.



In October, we will celebrate our local first responders who will be gifted with trays of home baked treats to recognize their selfless service to the community. Members will meet to assemble the trays, wrap them and top them with a beautiful bow and thank you note. Volunteers will then deliver them to the Prince William County Western District and Haymarket police stations, local firefighters and the Heathcote Hospital Emergency Room.

Our mid-November outreach is the "Holiday Baskets for Homebound Seniors," an annual event held at the home of Susie Collat. Members will fill holiday themed baskets with personal care items, word puzzles and sudoku books, playing cards, candies, warm socks, a soft blanket, snow globes and holiday decorations. A festive luncheon will be served courtesy of our hostess and Committee Co-Chair. After wrapping and decorating the baskets, the Co-Chairs will deliver them to "Volunteer Prince William" who will see that they are given to needy senior citizens and veterans.
